PASTOR'S PONDERINGS



"So let us know, let us press on to know the LORD. His going forth is as the dawn; and He will come to us like the rain, like the spring rain watering the earth." Hosea 6:3 NIV

A little girl had been shopping with her mom. She must have been 6 years old. She was this beautiful freckle faced girl, the image of innocence. It was pouring outside. The kind of rain that gushes over the top of rain gutters, so much in a hurry to hit the earth it has no time to flow down the spout. We all stood there under the awning and just inside the door of the store.

We waited, some patiently, others irritated because nature messed up their hurried day. I am always mesmerized by rainfall. I got lost in the sound and sight of the heavens washing away the dirt and dust of the world. Memories of running, splashing so carefree as a child came pouring in as a welcome reprieve from the worries of my day.

The little voice was so sweet as it broke the hypnotic trance we were all caught in. "Mom, let's run through the rain," she said. "What?" Mom asked. "Let's run through the rain!" She repeated. "No, honey. We'll wait until it slows down a bit," Mom replied. This young child waited about another minute and repeated: "Mom, let's run through the rain." "We'll get soaked if we do," Mom said. "No, we won't, Mom. That's not what you said this morning," the young girl said as she tugged at her mom's arm. "This morning? When did I say we could run through the rain and not get wet?" "Don't you remember? When you were talking to Daddy about his cancer, you said, "If God can get us through this, he can get us through anything!"

The entire crowd stopped in complete silent. You couldn't hear anything but the rain. We all stood silently. No one even moved in the next few minutes. The Mom paused and thought for a moment about what she would say. Now some would laugh it off and scold her for being silly. Some might even ignore what was said, but this was a moment of affirmation in a young child's life. This was a time when innocent trust can be nurtured so that it will bloom into faith.

"Honey, you are absolutely right. Let's run through the rain. If GOD lets us get wet, well, maybe we just needed washing," Mom said. Then off they ran!



The book of Hosea speaks about the outpouring of God's love and mercy on the people. In a world filled with chaos, division, hatred, and confusion, the prophet Hosea prays. Hosea prays a prayer full of confidence in God's love and God's power to restore. He reminds the people (us) to trust the love of God, and to see God's loving hand in their midst of their lives, in every situation and circumstance. Hosea encourages the people to persevere in God's love.

This is also an invitation to us, HCC, to trust the love of God for us and to see God's loving hand right here, right now with us.

Save Stamps for our wounded Veterans

Would you like a fun and easy way to help our military veterans who have helped us and suffered so much as a result?

Since 2014 our local Red Cross has been collecting cancelled stamps for a national program to help our veterans: "Stamps for the Wounded," which began in 1942. (For more specific details see stampsforthewounded.org)

This long successful program provides mental and physical stimulation ... "to fight the deadliest foe that hospitalized personnel must fight – ENFORCED IDLENESS and its deadly allies: boredom, loneliness, frustration, futility, and despair. (This program works) to relight the spark of interest and life in the weary eyes of a wounded or convalescent veteran ... eyes that without such help would stare at nothing but, what one G.I. called, 'white ceilings ... dark futures.'"

It is easy to be a part of this program. Simply save stamps: any used stamps, with cancellation marks or not. (Avoid the common stamps such as the non-profit and bulk rate USA stamps, and current US flag stamps.) Cut around them with a 1/8" to 1/4" margin. When you get a bunch, drop them off at the Sanctuary entrance or in Roberson Hall.

If you have any old envelopes or unique cancellation markings, save the whole envelope with the stamp, uncut.

Also, any sort of stamp collection, and any books or materials related to stamp collecting are greatly desired.

To help our wounded veterans each of us can do a little, and as a church, Harrisena can do a lot.

Treasurer's ReportWelcome Summer of 2022

Your HCC Financial Officers have been hard at work to meet all the needs of the church. As you are all well aware, there is always a delicate balance of just how far the money goes. We have not only been acutely aware of all these necessary needs for the church and parishioners but we have spent a great deal of time coming up with ways to either save money or create new ways to raise funds for HCC.

To date, there are 23 pledges for 2022 - down from 2021, which means we are down 1 pledge

We have a pledge commitment of \$36,860.00 to date for 2022.

We have collected \$18,875.00 Pledged Offerings to date.

We have collected \$8,394.00 in Non-pledge Offerings to date.

Technology has received a total of \$6,312.25 in donations to date.

Total Fundraising that has been received is \$2,369.50 to date.

As of June 16, 2022, our savings account is showing \$137,482.75 minus the Ross Grant that we just received for \$40,000 - we will be adding this to the HCC savings account.

Thank you all for making our job so satisfying by showing us your love and support.
