#### **PASTOR'S PONDERINGS**

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" And Jesus replied to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. The second is like it, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself [that is, unselfishly seek the best or higher good for others].' The whole Law and the [writings of the] Prophets depend on these two commandments."

Matthew 22:36-40 NIV

By air, land, and sea, Russia has launched a devastating attack on Ukraine, a European democracy of 44 million people.

Violence in eastern Ukraine between Russian-backed separatist forces and the Ukrainian military has by conservative estimates killed more than 10,300 people.

For the first time in more than a month, the country is averaging fewer than 2,000 newly reported deaths a day. Despite the steep decline, thousands of Covid-19 deaths continued to be announced each week.

When the nonpartisan Pew Research Center recently surveyed people in 17 countries in Europe, Asia and North America, Americans were the most likely to say their society was split along partisan, racial and ethnic lines. The U.S. also reported more religious division than almost any other country surveyed.

The U.S. was also one of five countries in which more than half the public said their fellow citizens can't agree on basic facts.

Writing in the aftermath of World War II, Elton Trueblood looked back to those few brave German Christians who had the courage to oppose Adolph Hitler. When so many others went along or simply kept silent, a few, a courageous handful, would not go along with the majority. Trueblood asked the question, "What made these people different? Why did they say no when everyone else said yes?" His answer was simple: "They had **the First Commandment**." That made all the difference. When you have the First Commandment, when you take it seriously as a way of life, you find the courage to stand against the crowd.

In the twenty-second chapter of Matthew, an expert of the law from among the Pharisees asks Jesus one last question in order to test him. He asked, "Which commandment in the law is greatest?" Jesus' answer is classic. Loving God is the first thing, the most important thing. But, with it comes a corollary: to love God means that you also love God's people. The ancient rabbis put it in similar terms: "What is hateful to you do not do to your neighbor. That is the whole Law."

For many, it seems that Christianity comes down to the "Golden Rule" of love your neighbor as yourself. The command to love your neighbor is actually found in the Hebrew text also in Leviticus 19:18. Yet, not many verses later, we find the command to love the alien (stranger) as ourselves in Leviticus 19:34: "The stranger who resides with you shall be to you as the citizen among you; **you shall love the stranger as yourself.**"

The headlines noted at the beginning of this meditation show the stark reality of our world today. So often we discount the scriptures as old and irrelevant and yet, these headlines help us better understand the necessity of God's word and the command to love, for **God is LOVE.** As a church, the Body of Christ, we are called to show the world what love looks like and maybe, just maybe when we do, even we will find that **neighbor and stranger are not such different categories after all.** 

#### Dear God,

Give us the courage to love as you have loved us. Amen.

The next HCC sponsored Red Cross Blood drive is scheduled for Friday, August 19, 2022.






## "OUT to EAT"
