PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Listen to the long stillness:
New life is stirring
New dreams are on the wing
New hopes are being readied:
Humankind is fashioning a new heart
Humankind is forging a new mind
God is at work.
This is the season of Promise.
(Howard Thurman)

The Lenten Season is the season of Promise. It is an invitation toward whole-heartedness. The heart is an ancient metaphor for the seat of our whole being—to be whole-hearted means to bring our entire selves before God, our intellect, our emotional life, our dreams and intuitions, our deepest longings. For many, there is a feeling that divides us, an internal conflict between what we most desire and how we live our lives. The ancient monks described the "cave of the heart" as that inner place where we encounter God and wrestle with our inner voices. Instead of resisting these voices, and dividing ourselves, the desert mothers and fathers invite us to be fully present to them, to create a welcoming space within (www.patheos.com).

This welcoming space creates the longing for and insistence of complete unwavering sincerity before God. It also requires accountability of the soul lived out in this world before all of humanity. "Unwavering sincerity," penned Howard Thurman, "says that humanity should always recognize the fact that the human being lives always in the presence of God, always under the divine scrutiny, and that there is no really significant living for an individual, whatever may be their status, until the individual has turned and faced the divine scrutiny." It is when we seek to make meaning of our ideas, our feelings, our hopes, and our aspirations, rather than merely objectively describing them, that we begin to make sense of life. It is the stirring of our souls for the promise and purpose of our days.

Although this inward focus begins with contemplation and examination, it moves us to an outward, more interdependent life. This movement is a space and place where life is lived abundantly. It is always aware of relating, relating to God, relating human to human, and relating to the evolution of the newness of each breath, each heartbeat, each morning, and God promise of new life. God is at work.

"in reference to your former manner of life, you lay aside the old self, which is being corrupted in accordance with the lusts of deceit, and that you be renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new self, which in the likeness of God has been created in righteousness and holiness of the truth." Ephesians 4:22-24 NIV

May this season of Promise open in us a desire to hear the long stillness, the stirring in our souls, the openness to embrace the inner voices, and the commitment to the journey toward whole-heartedly before God and each other.


The Worship Committee is pleased to offer the following opportunities to help enhance your Lenten Journey this year:

Mission's Report


Your Mission's Committee continues to help our community and we give monthly **Open Door**, and during the winter months we give to **Code Blue**.
