PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

LOOK TO GOD

The story of the Exodus is the greatest Old Testament foreshadowing of the gospel of Jesus the Christ. In Exodus 12, the people of Israel are miraculously released from slavery and led out of Egypt by Moses. And by Exodus 14, **Israel is encamped by the Red Sea**, in a vulnerable and probably puzzling position. **God has purposefully instructed Moses** to lead Israel there.

There, the Israelites panicked. They were confused. There they were when Pharaoh's army showed up and pinned them all against the sea. They were afraid. It looked like they would experience death by sword or death by drowning. There they believed they would perish. So, they focused their anxiety, fear, and anger on Moses. The people said to Moses, "Is it because there are no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness? What have you done to us in bringing us out of Egypt?" (Exodus 14:11).

The people of Israel were trapped. They saw no way out and no way through this situation. They could only see the water in front of them and the army behind them. **They could not see God.**

But Moses told the people, "Don't be afraid. Just stand still and watch the Lord rescue you today. The Egyptians you see today will never be seen again. The Lord himself will fight for you. Just stay calm." (Exodus 14: 13-14 NLT)

Moses is saying: Fear ye not, stand still — make yourselves to stand. Let not your hearts fail, or sink, or stagger, through unbelief: but with quiet minds look up to God. The Lord shall fight for you, and ye shall hold your peace — You shall contribute nothing to the victory, neither by your words nor by your deeds."

It is quite interesting that Moses, the meekest man above all men on the earth (Numbers 12:3) does not enter into the panic or fear or anger. He answers them through the eyes of faith. He does not chastise them. He comforts them. He rests in the peace and presence of God. Moses' response is with an admirable presence of mind, not in the least disconcerted or disheartened, either by the approach of Pharaoh, or the trembling of Israel. **Moses offers them adivine reset**, he refocuses their murmurings by calmly encouraging them to take heart and **trust in God. WOW!**


Have you ever felt like you were in a dire situation where it seemed that you had no place to go, no way out...or through? Maybe, just maybe, this is exactly where youneed

to be. Maybe, just maybe when we find ourselves deeply discouraged, it is possible that these very limitations and adversities serve to cultivate in us strong, courageous, and liberating faith. These places offer opportunities for transformation, for hope, and most importantly, for us to see God. **Moses points the people to God.**

Where is God in your life today? Have you looked to your own understanding to "figure things out" or have you allowed God to show you "the way through"? I am often reminded that our ways are not God's ways, nor our thoughts God's thoughts. Our greatest victories come when we seek our answers from God, not ourselves — when we put our trust in God.

Are you just a little curious about what God has planned for you, for your life? Are you interested in finding out what God has planned for Harrisena Community Church? Great! Do not let your hearts fail, or sink, or stagger, through unbelief: but with a quiet mind and a trusting heart look up to God. You shall contribute nothing to the victory, neither by your words nor by your deeds. God will do it! Hallelujah! Amen.

FINANCE OFFICER'S REPORT

Dear Family and Friends,

If you are reading this letter, you have a connection to Harrisena Community Church and may be aware we are now in our "*stewardship season.*" Our proposed budget has been mailed, emailed and handed out at Council and Church. The budget will be voted on at the November 12, 2023 Annual Meeting following the church service which begins at 9:30 a.m.

Please consider the following:

- We have created a realistic annual budget. This has been reviewed and approved by Council.
- We have made our congregation aware that we have more expenses than income and thus are tapping into our savings account.
- Financial Officers have purchased CDs to get extra income and sought best practices in paying our bills.
- Our secretary and organist have not had a recent raise, although they both deserve it.
- Our pastor has not asked for a raise since she began her tenure here at Harrisena.
- We have held fundraising events and programs to generate additional income.

- Committee members, our pastor and church officers pay for many expenses out of their pockets.
- We reach far beyond our community with our video technology in use and have gained new folks as a result.

This year, we are going to simply incorporate our "Harrisena Supporter" ideas into the Stewardship campaign. If you can, for example, give up a Starbuck's Coffee or other nonessential, put that money aside for Harrisena by placing the donation in an envelope marked "Harrisena Supporter." Envelopes are also available in the basket at the back of the sanctuary for this purpose. So far, we have collected over \$2500 toward our goal of \$4000 by the end of December. If we all give a little more than our pledge or ordinary donations, we will cut back on our deficit and continue to go forward.

Let's simply do our best to give more, whenever possible, so our beloved church continues to spread the good news of God's love for us all. Thank you for your prayerful consideration.
