PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

To Love God

Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. These commandments that I give you today are to be on your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads. Write them on the doorframes of your houses and on your gates. Deuteronomy 6:4-9 NIV

The Shema is at the heart of Jewish faith, but the rest of us can learn from it, too.

The book of Deuteronomy starts out by giving a brief review of the events that have happened to Israel up until that point. Moses reminds them of God's deliverance out of Egypt, of their journey through the wilderness, of the spies who went into the land, of their refusal to go in and seize the land, and how God had sentenced them to wander in the wilderness for 40 years. But now all that is behind them. They are the edge of the Promised Land once again, so the question before them is whether they will rise to the challenge this time.

The challenge is to love God and to proclaim love as their lifestyle. Ultimately, showing in every word, act, interaction or deed that the Lord God is their "one and only."

The Shema is not saying that God is the only God and there is none other. In the biblical traditions, there was a keen sense of other gods like Asherah, Baal, Moloch and Astarte. Much of the Deuteronomistic tradition is concerned with the fact that in a context of many gods, one will according to the covenant relationship pledge allegiance to the God of Abraham, Sarah and Hagar, Isaac and Rebecca, Jacob, Rachel, Leah, Bilhah and Zilpah alone. The primary obligation for Israel was to love God with the heart, with the center of all passion and trust. This is the primary purpose of human life.

Today we don't hear of many religions that are genuinely polytheistic. But ours is a society that does have many gods with a small letter "g." We worship the god of money, the god of success, the god of sex, the god of popularity, the god of politics, the god of science, the god of our own social constructs. We have to admit that although we love God to some extent, God is often not the only One we love, and sometimes God is not the One we love the most. Many other things tug at our heart.

The Shema calls us to love God knowing that God is love.

God is the actual source of our love for Him. God loved us first, and God *infused* us with God's own love. To *infuse* means to fill, to pervade, even to soak. We are being soaked with the love of God and the love of God in us is the love that we are given to love God in return.

Harrisena Community Church stands at the edge of a new era in the life of the church. We have a wonderful opportunity to rise to the challenge. Will we love God with all that we are? Remember the legacy of Louisa Larrabee Atherton Harris who loved God with all her heart. Her desire was to have a church to teach and study the Bible. She wanted a church to worship God. She wanted her community to know of God's love. This is the legacy of Harrisena Community Church, to love God and to share that love with our community.
