PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

"For I know the plans I have for you declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." Jeremiah 29:11, NIV

Standing on tiptoe is not a children's game of balance. Rather it is the beautiful prayer of balancing God's promises with our hope and expectation. Moving Our Mission Forward with Mediation

On June 12, 2021, the congregation held a special meeting to discuss interests to address as we move forward with the mission of the church. Later that month, we meet again to review the results of the June 12 meeting and to begin designing an approach to address our common interests. We concluded that the best approach for our church was to address specific interests through our Church Council, boards, and committees beginning in the fall of this year.

At the end of September, Dr. Wimberly, Doris O'Rourke, Jim Ferris, and Reverend George Stefani, who facilitated our June meetings, met to discuss our next steps. We discussed that a key element in moving forward is to keep our focus on the mission of our church. We have intentionally formed a church with a mission to be an inclusive, welcoming Christian community who welcomes a diversity of beliefs as together we share in the Christian principles of faith, love, and service to others. Our approach then will be to address those interests in ways that strengthens our mission.

We are looking forward to holding a Saturday morning meeting of the Church Council with Reverend Stefani to begin working a process to address our interests concerning church governance and communications. We also expect to start similar meetings with the Pastor-Parish Relations Committee to work through our interests of faith and worship development. Progress will be reported at regular meetings of the Church Council meetings and through future articles in the Harbinger.

We are off to a good start as together we strengthen the fabric of our congregation and our mission to the community.



Dear Members and Friends of the Harrisena Community,

We are certainly living through some difficult and strange times. Still, as children of God, we know ourselves to be blessed no matter the current circumstances.

Blessings are still a big part of our congregation. Despite the pandemic, our Trustees and Pastor found ways to keep Sunday services happening safely for all of us. We never missed a Sunday of worship, be it virtual, conference call or in person. New ministries were born for us. The Friday Meal Program was developed during the pandemic. Our church served well over 1000 meals and continues to prepare and deliver meals. Harrisena hosted three successful BBQ's which included donations of over 90 Meals of Love. We celebrated Christmas with a live nativity scene by our Sunday School students, Christmas Eve Festival of Lights with luminaries, and donated a decorated tree to the Prospect School Festival of Trees. We continued our usual support of the Red Cross Blood Drives, our three International children, Family Services and Open Door donations as well as the Hudson Falls Backpack Program. Cards, gift bags and calls were made to keep us connected to our members and friends.

GENEROSITY is how Harrisena responds to our many blessings. We hope that our generosity improves the lives of our neighbors. We pray that generosity improves us. It changes our relationship with our "stuff" and changes our relationship with God. Generosity moves our perspective to trusting God instead of only relying on our hard work, our knowledge, and our resources. What a relief to understand that we can rely on more than ourselves!

This year's Stewardship drive will be focused on the Harrisena Community's responses to two questions. In early November we will report back to you on those responses. It has been said that Harrisena is "The Friendly Little StoneChurch on the Ridge with the Big Heart." What does that mean to you? We are also going to ask you to respond to the question "Why is Harrisena here?" It is our hope you will give these queries serious thought and offer your response by either filling out slips of paper we are going to have in church or sending responses by mail or email to the church office.

Your pledge is the best way to let our congregational leadership know how much financial support Harrisena is likely to see next year. If you can afford to increase your pledge, please consider that Harrisena is poised to expand our engagement with the community and our own church family. Harrisena has done it in the past and we can do it again.
