HONOR ROLL

"Now faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see. This is what the ancients were commended for. By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible." Hebrews 11:1-3 NIV

Did you know there are several honor rolls in the Bible? One of them can be found in the Book of Hebrews. We hear about people such as Abel, Enoch, Noah, Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Jacob, the people who passed through the Red Sea, and Rahab. We learn that the walls of Jericho fell by faith. Then we read these words, "I do not have time to tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson and Jephthah, about David and Samuel and the prophets, who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, quenched the fury of the flames, and escaped the edge of the sword; whose weakness was turned to strength; and who became powerful in battle and routed foreign armies. During the pandemic the church thrived under conditions none of us had ever experienced before. The Board of Trustees' ministry became very challenging. They had to navigate the ever-changing statistics from Warren County Health Department and the CDC to make the best possible decisions regarding church attendance and safety. **Thank you**, Hal Payne, Sean Loonan, Bill Loeb, Shelley Durkee, and Chuck Ogden. WOW!

As a church community, we discovered new ways of continuing our services. We never missed a Sunday of worship (virtual, conference call-in) and we heard the call to new ministries. The Friday Meal Program developed during the pandemic! Sue Ogden and Deanna Payne pulled Fellowship and Mission Committees together. To date, this ministry has served over 1000 meals. Harrisena hosted three (3) successful Chicken BBQ's and raised over \$3000. Hal and Deanna organized and implemented these BBQ's so well that other churches and organizations began to see the possibilities and followed the HCC example. With hearts filled with love, these fundraisers became mission projects. Meals of Love were given to the Veterans' Home, NYS Troopers, the Warren County Sherriff's Department, and Bryan's House. Over 90 meals were donated. WOW!

Harrisena kept believing and kept serving!

Jim Ferris (president of the congregation) kept us focused on **HCC's mission and vision** in our monthly council meetings. HCC kept its focus and kept serving. The Fellowship Committee

supported our Christian Education program, and we were able to put on a **live nativity**, celebrate the **Hanging of the Greens**, invite the community to participate in the **HCC Christmas Eve Festival of Lights**, and participate in the **North Country Festival of Trees.** We decorated a Christmas tree that sold for \$90 with the proceeds donated to the Prospect Center at the Center for Disability Services. WOW!

Our Financial Officers (Ken Zacharias, Bonnie Nadig, and Janet Wilson) made sure the HCC finances were receiving the **highest interest rates** possible. They even attended financial training to learn to better serve HCC and its members. Their efforts yielded great results such as interest earned on accounts, **bills paid on time, no late fee occurrences, monthly financial reports** and evaluating HCC's holdings in order to make **wise and appropriate financial management accordingly.** WOW!

The HCC Outreach Committee (Melissa Ferrie-Healy, Pam Loeb, and Peggy McArthur) hosted **Blood Drives** and stayed connected to our members and friends by sending cards and making phone calls. Our Mission Committee (Sue Ogden, Mary Alice Clickner, Phyllis Straut) **continued to fund** three international children through **Plan International** with a \$366 yearly donation. Monthly donations of \$100 are sent to **Family Services Association** and the **Open Door and** \$500 to **Hudson Falls Primary School** to help fund their **Backpack Program**. The Mission Committee also continued to help needy families through **Family Service Association** during the holiday season by donating \$500 this year. WOW!

An anonymous donor decided to celebrate HCC's vision, mission, and ministries by taking all those who made pledges out to a **Prime Rib Dinner**. This was a delicious celebration! Robert Kellogg and his mother, Carolyn Kellogg donated time, resources, and energy to keep our **campus lawn well-manicured** and our **parking lot brightly lit**. Ralph Wilson went back to school to learn how to update the **cemetery and renewed** much of the cemetery. Members and friends of Harrisena sent **offerings and special gifts** to continue the ministries of HCC. WOW!

FINANCIAL REPORT

As of September 1st, Harrisena has completed two thirds of its fiscal year. Twenty-four Harrisena members have made pledges for 2021 totaling \$37,369.00 and are faithfully fulfilling those pledges. Non-pledged income to date is \$9,560.00 which is more than twice the amount budgeted for the entire year for unpledged income. It appears that, although having not pledged, many Harrisena friends and members are continuing to support Harrisena Community Church. However, it is predicted that the total of pledged and non-pledged income will fall approximately \$10,000 short of the amount budgeted for the year for those two categories.

Because Harrisena Community Church is designated as one of seven non-profits supported by the Ross Grant, we have received \$40,000 this year from the Grant. This Grant money is being used out of necessity for operation of the church.

To date our expenses total \$67,540.00 for two-thirds of the fiscal year. Expenses are being carefully monitored so that, when possible, savings can be realized. The separate Harrisena Savings Account presently has a balance of \$195,000.00. However, it will be necessary to withdraw large sums of money from that account in order to pay expenses for the remainder of the year. It is possible, depending on expenses, that \$20,000.00 or more may need to be withdrawn from that account.

To summarize: the approved 2021 budget estimated there would be approximately a \$15,000.00 deficit for the year. As of September, it appears that deficit prediction may be accurate.

As has been done for the past two years and according to the by-laws, The Finance Committee composed of your Financial Officers, Rev. Wimberly, the Council President and a Head Trustee will be meeting in September to develop a proposed budget for 2022. This budget will then go in October to the trustees for their approval before being presented in November to the congregation for their approval.
