PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

DREAMS AND ADVENTURES

And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road. Matthew 2:12

The journey of the magi began in their ordinary everyday routine and where abouts. God reached beyond social structures. God reached out to shepherds as well as to the Wise Ones. God reached beyond people frightened by the very presence and glory of God to those who observed and followed the constellations with curious intrigue to follow a star to the King. All along the way, God directed them, first by a star, then through the prophetic writings found in the Book of Micah, and finally in their dreams.

God does whatever it takes to reach out to and embrace all people. God announces the birth of the Messiah to shepherds through angels on Christmas, to the magi by a star on Epiphany, and to the political and religious authorities of God's own people through visitors from the East. From a manger, where a child lies wrapped in strips of cloth, God's reaches, God's embraces the world.

Jesus eats with outcasts and sinners. Jesus touches people who are sick and people who live with disabilities. Jesus even calls the dead back to life. Jesus offers eternal life to all people as he hung upon the cross. In Jesus the Christ, no one is beyond God's embrace, no one is beyond God's love.

In 2017, Bruce Epperly wrote a book titled, *The Work of Christmas: The 12 Days of Christmas with Howard Thurman.* In this book, Epperly captured some of Dr. Thurman's writings in the context of Christmastide and the Feast of Epiphany. Dr. Thurman's writings, speak so profoundly to the inexhaustible presence of God's love and embrace. His words invite us to a journey where limits of time and space do not hold us bound or captive, but free us for the adventure of a lifetime. Thurman points us to the journey before us. He writes, "Once this spirit becomes part of a person's life, every day is Christmas and every night is freighted with the dawning of fresh, and perhaps holy, adventure."

Maybe, just maybe Christmas is not only a season, "but a state of mind that dwells tenderly on the simple things, that looks for beauty in ugliness, and seeks peace in conflict (Epperly, 2017)".

This is revelation! It is *God's kingdom come; God's will be done on earth as it is in heaven.* This is invitation! It is your time and my time to discover and develop spiritually. This is faith in action! It is the proclamation of God's revelation of love in unexpected places and in unexpected people in real and tangible ways. God's love and light can be found everywhere...even right where you are.

"We never know where a dream can take us. The light can take us to unexpected places. Holy adventures can't be predicted, but one thing is certain: noticed or unnoticed, obvious or hidden, God will guide us as we go forth, following stars and dreams toward unexpected destinations" (Epperly, 2017).

May God grant us, Harrisena Community Church, dreams and adventures that take us to places and spaces that change our world for God. Maybe we will even create some of these spaces and places along the way.

The members of the PRC are Peter Cartier, Pam Loeb, Donna Davison Smith and Rev. Natalie C. Wimberly. We are using a handbook for Pastoral Relations provided by the American Baptist Churches, USA.

The roll of the PRC:

Foster good dialog rather than being a complaint department

- Stay focused on the Mission of the Church
- Help communicate the message of hope
- Support the Pastor

As we begin this process of developing healthy Pastor/Congregation relationships, we need to have scriptural underpinnings. We are all part of the solution and need to remember to be hard on issues and soft on people.

1 Corinthians 12:12-31 shows us the scriptural underpinnings for our work. Just as a body, though one, has many parts, it's many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit to form one body – whether Jews or Gentiles free – and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. Even so the body is not made up of one but of many. Now if the foot should say "But am I not a hand, I do not belong to the body," if not for that reason stop being part of the body, if the ear should say, "Because I am not an ear, I do not belong to the body. If the whole body was an eye, where would the sense of hearing be. If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? But in fact God has placed the part of the body, every one of them, just as he wanted it to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts but one body.
