ARTICLE FOR HARBINGER FROM TRANSITION TEAM

At Council on Tuesday, July 8, 2025, the Transition Team recommended the following action be taken with regard to a part time pastor.

Due to our financial situation, we are seeking a part time pastor, which action was voted on and approved by our congregation. Rev. Wimberly is welcome to apply.

In the meantime, Rev. Wimberly has agreed to serve in a temporary part time position for the months of August and September, 2025 while we accept applications. This offer would include a 20-hour work week for \$400 per week with no benefits except the use of the parsonage, with all the house expenses included. This temporary part time position would require a weekly report to the Council noting the duties done during a 20-hour work week. On September 30, 2025 the temporary part time position ends, including all benefits, and we will be offering \$200 for guest ministers to conduct Sunday services.

Rev. Wimberly provided "Hours of Service Worksheet for 20 Hours/Week" for the Committee's review, as well as an Agreement outlining what she would expect as a part time pastor. The Committee is currently reviewing these documents and will keep the congregation advised when a formal agreement is worked out.

Please keep Harrisena in your prayers, especially that these steps will be enough to see us through these difficult financial problems so we may remain a beacon of light for our congregation and community.
