PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

HOPE FOR THE JOURNEY

I am so excited about this new church year! A new church year signifies a time of hope. It points us to times when conscious attention is given to the mysterious power and presence of God in our lives and in the world. *These are days filled with hope.*

Hope is commonly used to mean a wish. Its strength is the strength of the person's desire. In the Bible, hope is the confident expectation of what God has promised. In this way, *hopes foundation and strength is in God's faithfulness*.

In times of uncertainty and fear, the 43rd chapter of the Book of Isaiah, urges us to be alert for the signs of God's continued presence, working to sustain and redeem even to this day. The people of God are in exile. Their past a trail of broken dreams, disappointments, shame and horror, their present filled with the constant ache for home. Imagine then, consumed with the past and present, there was little mental or emotional energy to think about the future. In the midst of this, God sends a message to the people through the Prophet Isaiah. "Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" (Isaiah 43:18-19) There is hope!

The prophet is not content to have the people wax nostalgic about the "good old days." It is not on the past as the past that the prophet wants the people to concentrate. The prophet aims to create an imaginative space in the minds of the people so that their conception of the past can transform their understanding of the present and, thus, the future: "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" In a seemingly hopeless situation, the prophet calls on the people not to lose heart but to look with anticipation for the signs of God's approaching redemption, for the "new thing" that is coming. God was doing a new thing for Israel and God is doing a new thing today for us.

This is hope. Audacious. Unbridled. Expansive. Fulsome. Hope leans fully into the future with the conviction of what God can and will do for God's people. The power and goodness of God working boldly and intentionally in the life of God's people. There is no challenge too hard, no obstacle too great, no body of water too wide, no desert too dry to keep God from creating or recreating the necessary conditions for God's people to flourish and all of creation to give honor and praise to God. *God is doing a new thing!*

This is a wonderful and very necessary word for the Church to hear today when there is so much change and upheaval. Inside the struggles of social and political unrest, food

and housing insecurity, immigration politics, and the threat of another season of disease and death, God is at work. God is still making roadways in the wilderness and rivers in the desert. *God is still doing extraordinary, unimaginable, and seemingly impossible work in all of our struggles*. Just as this announcement inspired hope for the Jews in exile so many thousands of years ago, may it inspire hope in us, too. God is preparing the world to be a place for all human beings to live, flourish, and to walk and talk with God. This is the ultimate redemptive work of God in the world.

The character of our God has not changed. God's grace and power have sustained us in the past, will see us through the present, and guide us into the future. Therefore, our faith journey is always filled with hope trusting in God.

Some folks called ahead to reserve a table and a good time was had by all. **Many of HCC members baked desserts** that were served to the attendees of the BBQ. Beverages including water, iced tea, lemonade, coffee and tea were provided. Donations totaling \$58 were left at the dessert table.













The **Blood Drive on Friday**, **August 18**, **2023 was a success**. Thirty five donors came to donate blood. The donors were able to enjoy some homemade desserts baked by Cheryl Evans, Shirley Harney and Sandra Chambers. The Red Cross Blood Drawers were served a lunch of tacos and chocolate chip pie. They were very grateful for the lunch and said they wanted to come back to work at HCC in January. **Thanks to Bob Evans**, **Melissa Ferrie-Healy**, **Pam and Bill Loeb and Pat Zacharias** for volunteering at the blood drive.



On Rally Day, Sunday, September 10, 2023 we will be having a Pot Luck Brunch. There is a sign-up sheet in Robinson Hall. **Bring breakfast or lunch items and join us as we begin the new Church year at HCC.**



At the last meeting of the Finance Committee, we discussed the need to develop a strategic plan for the next 12-months, 2- years and 5-years. This strategic plan would include working with our congregation and community to reduce our expenses and increase our income. We are determined to see Harrisena move into the future with a stable financial plan. We welcome suggestions from the congregation that help us meet this goal.

Harrisena has many great projects taking place that help us meet our financial responsibilities. Members of Harrisena have been bringing their empty cans & bottles to Rocket Recycling. They tell the clerk they wish to donate their refund to HCC. Then a Harrisena Financial Officer will periodically pick up a check from Rocket Recycling. To date we have received over \$1000 for our return of empties. Also, our recent Chicken BBQ resulted in a profit of over \$1300. A big thank you to everyone who supported this project.

The Ross Grant gave us \$34,000. This is less than the previous year. The Ross people had indicated that the size of their Grants mirror the economy of the year. The amount of their grant was expected. We are thankful for any amount received.

The Finance team has also been purchasing "CD's" now that the interest rates have risen. The monies from the sale of the land are invested at about 4% using the "ladder" approach of variable lengths of investment. Also, CD's were purchased from our Savings account at Glens Falls National at 5.25% for 9 months, when they offered this special rate for a limited time. These are just some of the ways we are attempting to raise income for Harrisena.

Our financial efforts have been beneficial, but we predict some possible challenges in the future. Despite our efforts we have continually needed to remove money from our Savings account in order to pay our bills. As of August 2022, our Savings account balance was \$172,000. A year later, as of August 2023, our Savings account balance is \$140,000. This is a deficit of \$32,000/year. If we continue at this pace, Harrisena's

Savings account will reach a \$0 balance in 4 to 5 years. The only monies left would be money held by Harrisena committees and land sale money...BUT we are planning!


One strategy for decreasing our budget deficit is by raising an additional \$4000 for 2023. We can do this over the next four months (September, October, November, December). If 20 people donated \$200 each, we would reach our goal. Additional donations and suggestions are welcome! To contribute to this special project, please write on your check "Harrisena Supporter" or place money in an envelope with "Harrisena Supporter" written on it. The Finance Committee will announce the progress of this project each month.


