PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

STAY CONNECTED!

"I am the vine. You are the branches. He who remains in me, and I in him, the same bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing." (John 15:5)

We have heard these words before, haven't we? But what is it about vines and branches? What do they have to do with our faith or our lives?

According to the Old Testament, the vine was a common image for the people of Israel. We hear about the song of the vineyard in Isaiah 5:7. Isaiah says, "the vineyard of Yahweh of Armies is the house of Israel." We hear similar references to the vine from Jeremiah and Hosea. In the Book of Jeremiah, the Lord says, "Yet I had planted you a noble vine, wholly a right seed." (Jeremiah 2:21) Hosea writes, "Israel is a luxuriant vine that puts forth his fruit." (Hosea 10:1) And in the Book of Psalms, these words appear:

"You brought a vine out of Egypt. You drove out the nations, and planted it. You cleared the ground for it. It took deep root, and filled the land." (Psalms 80:8-9)

So, when we hear Jesus speak of vines and branches, we must pay close attention. Jesus is the new Israel! Jesus is the one through whom God establishes a new covenant! The makeup of God's chosen people would no longer be determined by their race or their Jewish ancestry. Who they were and whose they were would be determined by their relationship with Jesus! It is the same today. We must connect and **stay connected to Jesus!**

"For he is not a Jew who is one outwardly, neither is that circumcision which is outward in the flesh; but he is a Jew who is one inwardly, and circumcision is that of the heart, in the spirit not in the letter." (Romans 2:28-29a)

In other words, just having your name on the roll isn't enough! Remember the old idiom: "Going to a church doesn't make you a Christian any more than going to McDonald's makes you a hamburger!" The joy of salvation comes from knowing God's presence, trusting that your sins are forgiven and having the assurance that in every situation and circumstance, God is with you and you are greatly loved by God!. So **stay connected to Jesus!**

The Jews in Jesus' day had the name, but they lacked the spirit. In much the same way, the church today are Christian churches, the question remains, how well do we know Jesus and who is Jesus to us? Is Jesus your Lord and Savior? Do you listen to His teachings? Do you follow His example? Do you walk in His fellowship?

Jesus is the true vine, the source of our covenant relationship with God. Jesus is the link that keeps us connected to God and each other. In the words of the old gospel hymn, he is the tie that binds our hearts together in Christian love. So, **stay connected to Jesus!**

It is my hope and prayer that you stay connected to Jesus and that you will be nourished and sustained to do the will and work of God in this world in real time.

A Time of New Beginnings

Rally Day – September 7

We will be holding a special Rally Day Worship Service on September 7th. Whether you're someone who regularly attends Harrisena or someone who hasn't stepped through the doors of our "Little Stone Church on the Ridge" for years, we would love for you to join us - ALL ARE WELCOME HERE!

On Rally Day, we will **formally install our new officers and committee members. We will pledge to empower them with our support and prayers**. We will then celebrate with an "Indoor Picnic" Fellowship immediately following the worship service. What a great way to kick off a new year of walking together with God!

Rosh Hashana – September 22-24

In addition to Rally Day, this September marks another fresh start. Most of us celebrate the calendar New Year on January 1st. Some are also aware that the *Christian* New Year begins with the Advent season. What you may not know is that the *Jewish* New Year falls in early autumn. Rosh Hashana (aka "The Head of the Year") marks the start of the Jewish High Holy Days, or "Days of Awe," consisting of a 10-day period of prayer, self-examination, and repentance leading up to Yom Kippur, "The Day of Atonement," and a year of judgement.

While Christians and Jews have different beliefs about the significance of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, Rosh Hashana is a religious holiday (like Passover) that we can share. We may not have focused on prayer, self-examination, and repentance since Lent, but now would be an excellent time to revisit those solemn practices, along with our Jewish brethren. This year, we are also anticipating a major transition as Rev. Wimberly prepares to pursue ministry elsewhere. What better time than now — at Rosh Hashanah - for us to immerse ourselves in prayer, self-examination, and repentance.

That said, Rosh Hashana is not about wearing sackcloth and ashes – it's a celebration of life's sweetness - a time to enjoy honey cakes, pomegranates, and apple slices dipped in honey! It's a time to share well wishes for a fruitful year ahead. In observing Rosh Hashana, we say, "Shanah Tovah U'metukah," which means, "May you have a good and sweet new year." Amen to that!

Guests in the Pulpit

You may be wondering what will happen when Rev. Wimberly completes her ministry at Harrisena Community Church at the end of September. We have not yet hired an interim pastor and have just begun our search for a more permanent pastor. For the next several months, we will be following the model set by the Lakeside Chapel in Cleverdale and the Potter's Grove Tabernacle in South Glens Falls: we will invite guest preachers filling the pulpit.

Our former interim pastor, Rev. Patti Girard, has graciously agreed to preach on Communion Sundays for September through December, including Rally Day and the Hanging of the Greens. Another familiar guest at Harrisena, Rev. Don Shuler, has agreed to preach a mini-series for several Sundays in mid-November. A complete list of guest ministers for October and November will be published in

the October Harbinger and will also be posted on our website calendar. Your prayerful support is needed as we endeavor to maintain continuity throughout this period of transition.


A Fresh New Look!
