PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

"I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."

Philippians 3:14 KJV

Someone once approached Blaise Pascal, the famous French philosopher and said, "If I had your brains, I would be a better person." Pascal replied, "Be a better person and you will have my brains."

Spiritual growth is the process by which Godly character is formed, strength of clear conscious and sound mind is amplified, and understanding is sharpened, as a result of which one can walk in divine wisdom.

In Philippians 2:5, the Apostle Paul encourages the church at Philippi to "Let this same attitude and purpose and [humble] mind be in you which was in Christ Jesus: Let Him be your example in humility." The mind, the orientation, the way of being that was in Jesus the Christ, is now in the Body of Christ, the church. Hearing this is an encouragement to us to compare or at least interrogate our priorities.

A recent Reuters poll reveals that Americans value "time" first, with "career," "success," and "money" coming in as close seconds for certain groups of people. What we value or prioritize most is likely demonstrated by how we spend our time and how we spend our resources.

There was a time when the Apostle Paul spent all his time and resources pursuing and persecuting Christians, establishing a successful career as a devout Pharisee. When he writes the letter to the Philippians, he has changed course so that he now spends all his time and resources pursuing Christ. His career success appears to be in shambles because he lands in prison for the sake of Christ. However, in Philippians 2:12-18, what looks like a failed career contributes to the fulfillment of Paul's calling as a minister to the Gentiles because he is now able to communicate the gospel to the prison guards. Paul's change of course demonstrates what he values most. The break is decisive. For Paul, it is a matter of life and death, and having broken with his former identity, he doesn't walk; he runs into the future.

Unlike his past, Paul's future is not about human striving. It is not about him. It is about a radical shift in perspective. Now Paul redefines what "true gain" is. It is being in relationship with God through Jesus the Christ! Paul says, it is about "the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord."

Paul does not desire a simple knowledge of books and facts, but of knowing the person of Jesus and holding fast to him. Paul's priorities have changed. For Paul, Jesus the

Christ is the threshold where his past and his future meet. Paul says, "I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus."

The word translated "high calling" literally means "to be filled up to the brim." Similar to that of a glass filled with water to the very top, Paul desired to be filled up to the very top with God's love. Furthermore, Paul believed that it was necessary for the follower of Christ to be a living spillover of God's LOVE.

Harrisena Community Church is an example of the kind of spillover Paul envisioned for the Body of Christ. We will soon celebrate our 155th church anniversary. This gives us the opportunity to reflect and to reassess our priorities. Is it Christ crucified? Is it spiritual growth in attitude and purpose and humility of mind, a Godly character? Is it the desire to share the love of God with this community and the world?

The Harris' faith in God manifest in the building of a sacred space for people to learn of and experience God's love. What were they thinking? They must have envisioned a spillover of God's love in this community and in the world. They must have been determined to be a part of it. They must have been filled with the same conviction that Paul had, all those years before them, to press toward the mark of the high calling in Jesus the Christ! WOW!

Will we become a part of this spillover? Do we desire, as they did to leave a legacy of God's love?

May we be filled to the brim with the Love of God. May LOVE spill over into a hurting world and may the overflow of LOVE show forth in generations to come.

Report from the PRC

We evaluated Rev. Natalie based upon her Call Agreement. The full content of the review are listed below. We used a scaled response format. An evaluation of 1 = ineffective, and a score of 10 = highly effective. We also included a section of reflection for ourselves as members of the congregation. It is our hope that we are able to use this information to encourage our own participation in this call/covenant agreement with our pastor going forward.

1. Provided regular services on Sunday and the usual Christian holy days:

4 people gave a 10 score

Comments: positive messages, love eagle metaphors, messages well aligned with my situation, how can we help you achieve what you see are ways we can move forward, heal and grow?

2. Led adult religious studies:

3 people gave a score of 10; 1 person gave a score of 8.5.

Comments: only attended one class, found it insightful, I attended a few workshops on Leadership. she was fantastically prepared. Thus, I had a good experience. she had pointed questions, prepared as well. various uses of audio-visual.

3. Facilitated confirmation classes

3 people gave an N/A; 1 person gave a score of 8.5

Comments: I just know she promotes them well in bulletin & we all celebrate their conclusion. Communicate more with parents and young people what would work for them.

4. Preached the Gospel

4 people gave a score of 10

Comments: I found all messages biblically based with good personal stories that help illustrate the gospel message, I find her to be an effective & dynamic preacher. She always reviews the scripture read, a story or more are always added. these become memorable & are relatable to the general public. Her analysis of the scripture is organized & thorough. She also speaks well, volume & tone are excellent.

5. Administered to ordinance of communion

4 people gave a score of 10

Comments: All good, you go above and beyond. Having the young people assist with worship/communion would help them understand the reason for communion and what it takes to achieve it in our church. 10+ Excellent, sacred & educational. Rev.Natalie truly holds dear this ordinance of communion. she often IMPROVISES A SPECIAL EXPERIENCE WHICH SHE MUST SHARE WITH US. She has also greatly respected what this church believes about who receives communion & HOW it is administered.)

6. Performed baptisms

3 people gave a score of 10 Scores; 1 person gave an NA

Comments: hasn't happened often but including the whole family is wonderful. Nice ceremonies. Beautiful how she also incorporates siblings & grandparents of the child being baptized, her ceremony is super meaningful... yet keeps room for fun.

7. Performed weddings

2 people gave a score of 10; 2 people gave an NA

Comments: You have helped the couples wishes for a Christian wedding be fulfilled. I've never witnessed this ceremony @ HCC YET. If it were ever to occur, my man & I respect & love her to officiate our own wedding.

8. Officiated at funerals and memorials

3 people gave a score of 10; 1 person gave an NA

Comments: offered the family a time of life celebration along with how God's grace can be there for them during a difficult time. although I've not witnessed this ceremony with Rev.Natalie.. I will say there have been several deaths during her 2 years with HCC. She has officiated everyone. And fulfilled this role.

9. Performed dedications

1 person gave a score of 10; 3 gave a score of NA

Comments: . I'm experiencing dedications unlike any other year. Rev. Natalie keeps us informed via announcements from the pulpit & email. She is an excellent recruiter. To me it seems she's been a member for "years". She excites & thrills us parishioners. Example: Rally Day, World Communion Sunday, The Apple Festival ...

10. Watched over the HCC membership

4 people gave a score of 10

Comments: You have been very caring and present for many of our sick and shut in members. Your phone calls show that your care is continuing. For me, she is available, caring and engaging. She has reached out to our family several times. This action of hers surprised me. She is exceptionally in touch with the heartbeat of her parishioners. Heavily involved in the actions & direction of our Christian Education program. I've also been impressed with her involvement & knowledge of all things re Council & Parish Trustees. Rev. Natalie stays informed. This is very obvious in her communique from the pulpit & during Fellowship time.

11. Promoted the spiritual interest and unity of the church.

4 people gave a score of 10

Comments: Congregation and leadership need to be more involved in this. She reaches out to members, promotes solutions and healing, and encourages new thinking. One example of where she does this... during the children's time.. she appeals maturely to us adults all the whole delivering a very interesting & entertaining.& EFFECTIVE. sometimes very eye- opening presentation to the children.

Self-Reflecting as a Church

Comments: Some of the leadership seems disengaged and micromanaging at times; Unhappy people lobby and seem to feel more comfortable with forming small groups to undermine rather than engage with a goal of building unity. We answer her call to make responses more joyful (more loudly). We participate willingly in the events sponsored by just her.

2. In what ways can the church support the pastor going forward?

Commentary: Communicate, Listen, Trust, Promote. Demonstrate a willingness to change and evolve. If people in the congregation know your hopes and plans for us, we may be able to respond to it better. LOUDLY express our AMEN s like she implores us to with her simple

"Amen?! "PRC can influence others to communicate with Rev. Natalie. Get to know her and acknowledge her as our pastor.

Commentary: Met with leadership to communicate issues/screw ups/successes, promoted the importance of the PRC, directed members to communicated directly with Rev. Natalie, joined PRC when it was reformed. We have not had a PRC for 2 years. We hope to be able to direct people to Rev. Natalie. I hope we can improve the overall communications. I only have become a PRC member in last month. So as a parishioner, ecstatic about her appointment as my pastor.


