PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8 NLT

EQUIPPED TO TURN THE WORLD UPSIDE DOWN!

J. B. Phillips writes in the preface to *The Young Church in Action*, that one cannot spend several months in close study of this book, "without being profoundly stirred and, to be honest, disturbed. The reader is stirred," he says, "because he is seeing Christianity, the real thing, in action for the first time in human history.

Here we are seeing the Church in its first youth, valiant and unspoiled...a body of ordinary men and women joined in an unconquerable fellowship never before seen on earth." But the reader is also disturbed, "for surely," he adds, this "is the Church as it was meant to be. It is vigorous and flexible, for these are the days before it ever became fat and short of breath through prosperity, or muscle-bound by over organization.

These women and men did not make acts of faith, *they believed*; they did not say their prayers, *they prayed*. They did not hold conferences on psychosomatic medicine, *they simply healed the sick*.

By modern standards they may have been naïve, but perhaps because of their very simplicity, perhaps because of their readiness simply to believe, to obey, to give, to suffer, and, if necessary, to die, the Spirit of God found that He could work in them and through them, and so they turned the world upside down!

This Sunday we will celebrate the Day of Pentecost! On the Day of Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came down to permanently dwell in Christ's followers. Through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit the church began. In John 14 and 16, Jesus speaks of the work of the Holy Spirit in the world and in their lives. In chapter 14, Jesus promises the Holy Spirit to be their guide, advocate, counselor, and comforter. He also assures them that he will not leave them alone. The Holy Spirit will teach them everything they needed to know and remind them of what He had taught them. Furthermore, the Holy Spirit will convict the world of its sin, and of God's righteousness and of the coming judgment.

The Holy Spirit's conviction led them to repentance, and 3,000 Jews put their faith in Jesus as their Savior and were baptized that day. The church was born! It grew from 120 to 3,120 in one day! Talk about exponential growth – and this was just the

beginning! That's the difference the Holy Spirit makes! When the Holy Spirit comes, lives are changed! The Day of Pentecost was the birthday of the Church!

I wonder... if we began to allow our hearts and souls to speak louder to us than the dictates of our modern age, what would be the impact on the world. In believing, would we not also pray and heal those who are sick? A bigger question *may be: Are we willing to risk not knowing what possibilities, what wonders, we, empowered by the Holy Spirit, are capable of?*

The indwelling of the Holy Spirit, the Spirit of God, is God with us. It is God loving us so much that God dare not leave us alone. It is God's blessing us, so that we too may bless others. It is God's love given to us, so that we may love others. This would certainly turn our world upside down or maybe right side up!!! Will we dare?

EXHALE...., then INHALE...

COME, HOLY SPIRIT COME...

BREATHE...

Repeat as often as you would like throughout your day and at night.
