PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

Therefore, remember that at one time you Gentiles in the flesh, called "the uncircumcision" by what is called the circumcision, which is made in the flesh by hands— remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, alienated from the commonwealth of Israel and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world. But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility. (Ephesians 2:11-14 ESV)

William Booth had just stepped into the pulpit when members of his congregation started their vocal protest. They were angry that their pastor continued to invite street people into their sanctuary and church home. These unsavory people belonged elsewhere, but not in their church. Before William Booth could respond, his wife Catherine answered for him. She yelled from the first row of the balcony, "Never!" She was telling the congregants they would never stop inviting the homeless and downtrodden into the church. They would never stop inviting their brothers and sisters who had little to offer in material things into the church. They would never stop loving their sisters and brothers who needed their love the most. They would never stop opening their doors. They would never stop opening their hearts to God! This was one of several incidents that convinced the Booths to leave "fashionable" religion, leading them to the establishment of The Salvation Army.

So, then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord. In him you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by the Spirit. (Ephesians 2:19-22 ESV)

The Apostle Paul's message is timeless. Paul writes this letter during a time when Christians in Ephesus were living under the iron rule of Rome. Rome's emperors saw themselves as divine. They enforced their will on the people through military dominance and when necessary, the threat of crucifixion. Consequently, those gathered to hear Paul's letter put themselves in danger, but they were committed. Never would they allow the empire to separate them from the love of God. Never would they give up on their call to be built together into a dwelling place for God by God's own Spirit. Paul's message and the faith of these believers are relevant for us today.

Today the church is facing a huge missional, spiritual, evangelical, and theological uphill climb. To this Paul yells from the balcony of heaven, "Never!" Whether self-identified as Protestant, Pentecostal, non-denominational, or independent redefined by dogmas,

liturgy, ordination questions, immigration, human sexuality, and a host of many social, political, economic, and cultural injustices. Paul yells, "Never!"

God has called the church to be a celebration of unity in diversity never a church divided by human ideas or imaginations. God's love is the heartbeat of the Gospel of Jesus, never of hatred. The beauty and majesty of people and their diversity speaks to the vision of a world living together in unity as brothers and sisters in Christ, never strangers or aliens. The cross undermined the wall dividing Jew and non-Jew, but that was only the beginning. The death and resurrection of Jesus made it possible for the creation of a new humanity where all people, every nation, every tribe will live together in a relationship of peace and conciliation. Psalm 133:1 says, *"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!"* The Message Bible puts it this way, *"How wonderful, how beautiful, when brothers and sisters get along!"*

The church is summoned today to reconsider ways we can live together without walls of hostility between us. Worship of God is not simply a spiritual routine of a weekly "time out" on Sundays. The building of a holy temple is the daring and bold practice of faith. It is a counter-cultural way of being in this world — a different kind of power, the self-outpoured, boundary-crossing power of Jesus' cross. This is resurrection power –a living faith! Faith focused on living the love of God. Faith focused on doing the will of God. Faith focused on becoming a dwelling place for God.

This new church year is a new beginning for Harrisena Community Church. It is an opportunity to move forward. It is a time to see as God sees.

Maybe, just maybe the lives of the Apostle Paul, William and Catherine Booth, and the Church at Ephesus give us an audacious response to the world today. Maybe it is time for us to say, as they said, "Never!"

We too, must *never* stop the bold practice of faith in Jesus by sharing love, kindness, and compassion with everyone. We must *never* seek our own ways, or our own thoughts more than we seek God's ways and God's thoughts. We must *never* stop seeking God. We must *never* stop loving God and neighbor. We must *never* stop the process of becoming loving sisters and brothers! We must *never* stop learning to listen and hear as we communicate with one another. We must *never* abandon the divine mandate to build the Kingdom of God on earth, as it is in heaven.

God has amazing plans for Harrisena Community Church!


