PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus the Christ!

I would like to share a true story with you.

Everyone at the State University knew that Donner Hall had the best parties. All-night dancing and beer guzzling attracted the largest weekend crowds by far – especially on the notorious second floor. By midnight every Friday and Saturday, the entire second floor was three inches deep in smashed beer cans, empty wine bottles, and stale potato chips. But by about 7:00 a.m. the next morning, all of the garbage was removed.

The second-floor residents assumed the conscientious school janitors came bright and early, before anyone woke up, to sweep up the mess.

Early one Saturday morning, Chris, still hung over from Friday night's party, stumbled out of his bed to head for the bathroom. Noticing a freshly vacuumed second floor, he mumbled to himself, "I guess the janitors came early again to get rid of the mess."

On reaching the bathroom, however, his nose warned him the mess wasn't completely eliminated. A trail of vomit soiled the bathroom floor, ending at the point where someone was just then mopping it up. Chris thought to himself, I'm glad the janitor is doing the dirty work, so we don't have to.

At the sound of Chris's shuffling, the supposed janitor looked up.

Shocked, Chris realized the person mopping up the vomit was Marco, his next-door neighbor.

"Marco, man, what are you doing?" Chris asked. Marco answered simply, "I'm cleaning up." "Why?" You weren't even at the party last night." Marco answered, "Because I'm a Christian."

No janitor had ever cared enough to clean up every Monday morning.

It had been Marco the whole time. WOW!

Ask the person on the street what success is and you will find for the most part that people define success in terms of money, prestige, position, power or fame. Even churches are caught up in this mentality defining success in terms of number of members, size of budget or their public image. None of those things are evil in themselves, but when those things become the goal, the definition of success or the purpose of our lives, we have stepped away from godliness and into worldliness. We were created to reflect the truth about who God is.

The mother of James and John asked Jesus to allow her sons to sit on the right and left hand of him in his kingdom. They wanted the prestige of being the second and third most powerful, famous people in their world. But, do you remember Jesus' answer?

Jesus called them to Himself, and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great men exercise authority over them. It is not so among you, but whoever wishes to become great among you shall be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you shall be your slave."

Success and/or greatness in the kingdom comes from being a servant and a slave. We are called to be slaves of Christ and servants of His people.

When we confess Jesus the Christ as our Lord and Savior, the power of the Holy Spirit begins to transform us into the likeness of the Christ. Our thoughts, beliefs, actions, interactions, and *being* are transformed. We learn to live as God has called us to live. We learn to talk as God has designed us to talk. We learn to love as God has taught us to love. In the image of God, we are made fresh and new.

Marco is a wonderful example. He lives what Jesus teaches. Perhaps one of our greatest challenges has to do with our desire and willingness to serve. Are we willing to serve others, even when it cost us something? Are we willing to do what Jesus would do, even if nobody knew it was us doing it? Will we humble ourselves before God and others, even when it is inconvenient?

May God grant us the desire to do His will and to abundantly glean from his teachings. May we discover our best selves through this process. May we embrace the totality of this amazing journey!
