PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

I read a story recently written by Dr. Christophe Ringer. Dr. Ringer told a story about a dinner he attended when he served as a pastor of a church. He was invited to a dinner at a church member's home. Some other members were there as well. After a good meal and great fellowship people slowly began to leave. One of the guests made a to go plate that only had dessert on it. She said she was planning to freeze it so she could eat it after Lent. It is quite interesting how wonderfully human this was. The struggle is real. In many ways, this to go plate represents how many of us grew up thinking about Lent. Lent for many is simply the act of giving up something we enjoy for a brief time, then returning to it after forty days.

Giving something up can certainly be a positive step in the right direction, *if* we recognize this "giving something up" as a spiritual practice for creating sacred space for change.

During the Season of Lent, we have the opportunity to create and then enter into a sacred space designed to create room in our hearts, minds, and souls. This act of creating and then entering into are intentional practices of preparation. Preparation so that we may be transformed by the resurrecting power of God.

In the Christian tradition it is affirmed that the power that raised Jesus from the dead also dwells in us. "When he died, he died once to break the power of sin. But now that he lives, he lives for the glory of God. ¹¹ So you also should consider yourselves to be dead to the power of sin and alive to God through Christ Jesus." Romans 6:10-11 NLT

This power serves to make space for new ways of loving one another and being in community together. Now, our focus must first be to allow the transforming power of God to work in and through us. Our purpose therefore is to be transformed to be transformation. Ghandi said, "Be the change you wish to see in the world." I would restate this as "be the change God desires to see in the world."

The season of Lent calls us to greater insight as to the struggles for liberation in our society and in this world. **Social transformation is deeply related to personal transformation.** Transforming social structures also means transforming ourselves. This means acknowledging that the various "isms" and injustices we struggle against are not merely external to who we are. They continue and are maintained because they are lodged in our collective imagination and expressed in our social institutions. The quote attributed to Edmund Burke, "The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is that good men/women do nothing" is notable here. Another similar sentiment by John Stuart Mill was said in 1867, "Bad men/women need nothing more to compass their ends, than that good women/men should look on and do nothing." (italics added)

The more direct and accurate message is given to us by the Apostle Paul in Romans 12:2. Paul teaches, "Don't copy the behavior and customs of this world, but let God transform you into a new person by changing the way you think. Then you will learn to know God's will for you, which is good and pleasing and perfect." NLT

WOW! What wonderfully generous opportunities and work we have before us this Lenten Season, to be formed and transformed by the power of God's Holy Spirit through the Word and will of God.

May God bless us and keep us this Lenten Season.

May God's face shine upon us and be gracious unto us.

May God's countenance rest upon us all and give us divine dissatisfaction.

Let us be dissatisfied until the beauty of your diverse world is seen as the very reflection of your vision of paradise.

Let us be dissatisfied until every little girl and boy, every teen, every young adult, every woman and man, is seen and celebrated as one made in your image, creative, lovely, gifted, necessary...so that we may all finally realize that to embrace the humanity of each individual, each community, each culture is to grab hold of the answers to all of humanity's questions.

Let us be dissatisfied until every state capitol is housed by a governor who will do justly, who will love mercy, and who will walk humbly with his God.

Let us be dissatisfied until from every city hall, justice rolls down like waters, and righteousness like a mighty stream.

Let us be dissatisfied until that day when the lion and the lamb shall lie down together, and every human being sits under his own vine and fig tree, and none are afraid.
