PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

God's Paradise Restoration Plan: Part II "Noah finds favor with God – God's Image Bearers"

"But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD. This is the account of Noah and his family. Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked faithfully with God." Genesis 6:8b-9 NIV

We began a series last month in our first Harbinger publication of the new church year called "God's Paradise Restoration Plan". This series is part of our Discipleship Training. As we grow in the grace and mercy of God, we find ourselves in need, in need of greater faith, and deeper understanding of God (who God is and of who we are in relationship with and to God).

We started this series with a man named Enoch. We discover Enoch in the annals of scripture, in the Book of Genesis. In Genesis 5:22 we learn that, "Enoch walked (intimate habitual fellowship) with God." Walking with God was/is a way of life.

The word "walk" is the biblical expression for "fellowship and obedience with God that results in divine favor." It refers to the manner of life of a person living in nearness to God. Walking with God means "to conduct oneself in a particular manner" or to "pursue a particular course of life" (Dictionary.com: walk). Those who walked with God lived openly and transparently to God, with the intent to please God with how they lived. Their lives demonstrated a determined humility to do the will of God even if they had to stand alone. This month, we meet another person in the Bible who is known to have walked with God. We learn about Noah.

"But Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord. Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked faithfully with God."

Genesis 5:8b-9a NIV

Noah was the eighth-generation descendant of Adam, through the line of Seth. During Noah's lifetime, no one on earth walked with God, followed God or followed God's laws **except Noah**. "But Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord."

Finding favor means gaining approval, acceptance, or special benefits or blessings. There is also a close association with favor, grace, and mercy. The favor that human beings receive from God depends on God's good pleasure and is often extended in response to **prayer**, **just living**, **merciful relating to others**, **and humility**. The favor of God refers to a life transformed by the grace and mercy of God. Noah lived among a people who were wicked and evil, even so, he lived for God. **Noah's kinship was with God.**

Noah lived a righteous and blameless life and enjoyed close association and fellowship with God. **Noah's worldview was God's worldview!** This unique relationship between God and Noah exemplifies the relationship between God and humanity. It gives us a little glimpse of **God's original plan for Paradise**. Consequently, God's original plan for Paradise points us back to the beginning...the Book of Genesis.

The first chapter of the Book of Genesis gives us great insight into the creative mind and wisdom of God. "So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them" (Genesis 1:27). This is the revelation of image to image.

Images are created to display the original. God made humans in the Divine image so that the world would be filled with reflectors of the Divine — images of God – millions of human image bearers. Image bearers reflect something of God's nature and character. God's Image Bearers spend their lives discovering their connection with their original. On this journey of discovery, God's Image Bearers grow, little by little, into their natural capacity to reflect the nature and character of God. It is who they are! They are Image Bearers of God's goodness, love, mercy, justice, compassion, and with the Holy Spirit's help, holiness in the world.


Ephesians 5:1-2 says, "Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God." We are created, in the image of God, as dearly loved children of God, to love just as Christ willingly loved us sacrificially.

I John 2:5-6 teaches, "This is how we know we are in Jesus: Whoever claims to live in Jesus must walk as Jesus did." We walk with God and we walk as Jesus walked. It is our way of living that reflects God character and nature. It is a glimpse of God's original plan of Paradise. **Be God's Image Bearers!**

Let us pray:

Dearest God. Creator of all that is and ever will be.

You formed us in our mother's womb. Even then you knew us. Your hands crafted us into your own image and breathed into us your Spirit, that gave us life. How blessed we are to be surrounded by the beauty of your creation. Your ways are beyond our wonderings. We can hardly find words to express our gratitude and awe. Form us again and again until we look like you. Form us again and again until we are like you. Thank You for loving us first and for showing us the way of love. We love You, Lord. In the name of Jesus the Christ we pray. Amen.

We are collecting and delivering food and personal items to **Family Services** in Glens Falls. They are always so thankful to see us.



WHEN SCIENCE CATCHES UP TO BIBLICAL TRUTHS

Barbara Fredrickson, a professor of Psychology and Director of the Positive Emotions and Psychophysiology Laboratory at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, has been investigating the effect of positive emotions for more than thirty years. Her research shows that people with a positive attitude overcome difficulties more quickly and are more resilient. Based on her research, she developed the broaden-and-build theory, which uses positive emotions to solve developmental and growth challenges instead of solving survival issues.

A positive mindset is the breeding ground for creativity, expansive and visionary thinking, empathy, cooperation, and connection. Moreover, broadening one's mindset makes people better equipped to overcome adversity. Her findings shed light on how people with a positive mindset become stronger and develop exponentially in overcoming obstacles.

Two chemical messengers control our motivation and happiness when it comes to positive thinking — dopamine and serotonin. Our bodies release dopamine when we accomplish our goals and it gives us the rush to keep going so we can achieve even more. In contrast, we gain a feeling of calm, relaxation, and comfort when our bodies release serotonin.

Our bodies don't always regulate dopamine and serotonin in the way we want, and sometimes we can chase too much of one or the other in hopes of improving our mood. However, learning how to find balance in our lives helps us earn a steady flow of both neurochemicals. Maintaining a positive attitude is the key to unlocking that balance!


