PASTOR'S PONDERINGS

God's Paradise Restoration Plan: Part IV MARY, the mother of Jesus THE LORD IS WITH YOU!

Mary, the mother of Jesus, walked with God in the most unique way. Mary was a young woman chosen by God to be the mother of Jesus the Christ, the Messiah. God chose Mary out of all the women in her generation.

In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, **"Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."** Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. **You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High**. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end." "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?" The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. (Luke 1: 26-35 NIV)

Mary became pregnant with Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit. It was the Holy Spirit, the power of God that overshadowed her. Mary carried the Messiah, the baby Jesus, inside of her, in her womb, a womb made of flesh and blood. This was a time of the miraculous, the uncommon, the impossible becoming possible. This was God's doing and Mary, a woman of faith, obedience, humility, and a fear of The Lord, would be a part of it all. She was filled with humility and courage, meekness and strength. Mary had faith in God. She had faith in God's promises and faith in God's power to bring those promises to fulfillment. It took faith, a great deal of faith, for Mary to accept what the angel told her. It took faith to accept the extraordinary will of God in what seemed to be an ordinary life. It took faith to overshadow the fear and uncertainty of not knowing to bring forth a response of trust in the faithfulness of the All-Knowing God. Mary said, "I am The Lord's servant, may your word to me be fulfilled." It took faith!

Now faith is the assurance (title deed, confirmation) of things hoped for (divinely guaranteed), and the evidence of things not seen [the conviction of their reality—faith comprehends as fact what cannot be experienced by the physical senses]. ² For by this [kind of] faith the people of old gained [divine] approval. (Hebrews 11:1-2 AMP)

Imagine **the beginning of the human story.** God is in the Garden of Eden rebuking the serpent. God declares that the Seed of Eve will crush the devil's head. As God is saying this, the divine eyes are scanning the future, looking for a mother. God's gaze stretches past the law and the prophets and into the New Testament. As **the entirety of human history unfolds before God**, God sees millions of suitable women with faith. So, God decides to shorten the list. "*To demonstrate my glory, I will choose a woman with no name from a town of no significance in a country of no consequence.*" So, God whittles down the list and lands on Mary. In God's eyes, **Mary was the right person at the right time! So are you and me!**



HCC DECEMBER CHALLENGE: COURAGE

"Have I not commanded you?

Be strong and of good COURAGE; do not be afraid, nor be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:9 NKJV)

Courage is the ability to act in obedience to God's will and purposes, even when faced with fear, difficulty, or danger.

The **biblical characteristic of courage** is an essential quality for believers as they navigate through the challenges and uncertainties of life.

Courage is not the absence of fear but rather the willingness to act in obedience to God's calling and purposes, relying on His strength and guidance. The Bible provides numerous examples of individuals who displayed remarkable courage, empowered by their faith in God.

WHEN SCIENCE GETS A LITTLE CLOSER TO PERCEIVING GOD'S WISDOM Physiological response:

While experiencing fear in a courageous act is normal, individuals who demonstrate courage may show a reduced physiological response like lower heart rate and blood pressure compared to those who succumb to fear completely.

Furthermore, research suggests that having courage can positively affect the body by reducing stress levels, improving overall well-being.

In 2010, Israeli researchers found that activity in a part of the human brain called the subgenual anterior cingulate cortex (sgACC) is associated with courageous behavior. The neuronal connections in the sgACC can be strengthened by mindfully practicing courage such as mentally reframing our fears in the context of a bigger picture allows us to stay in the moment and avoid a sense of impotence.
