"All You Need is LOVE!"

Our focus for the month of February is LOVE, the foundation of our Christian faith. ***"For God so LOVED the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth on him should not perish, but have eternal life."***

John 3:16

That well-known verse slides so easily across our tongue! Who would suspect that love could be a CHALLENGE? Consider Paul's words to the Corinthians: ***LOVE is patient, LOVE is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. LOVE does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.***

1 Corinthians 13:4-5, NIV

Talk about a challenge! Who could possibly live up to such a standard?

Perhaps we're talking about apples and oranges here. **Consider this: the English word for "Love" encompasses multiple Greek words for "love." As humans, we naturally experience the following types of "love:"**

"Eros" - the romantic love between a man and a woman, such as Adam and Eve in the creation story.

"Storge" - the "brotherly love" and affection that family members have for one another.

"Philia" - a deep, meaningful, faithful friendship, such as the relationship between David and Jonathan.

We are familiar and well-versed with these types of love. **Yet human love, no matter how well intentioned, ultimately pales in comparison to the true and perfect love of God:**

"Agape" - the sacrificial, self-giving love that is primarily concerned with the good of someone else. Agape love is demonstrated through actions, such as God sending his only begotten son so that "... whosoever believeth on him should not perish but have eternal life."

Despite our human shortcomings and failures, we continue to receive the overflowing agape love of God. And we are called to share that same type of love with others, acknowledging our own inadequacy as we point others toward the One who can truly satisfy their desire to be loved.

“He who does not love does not know God, for God is love.”

1 John 4:8

So yes, LOVE is a worthy focus this month. **Let’s pause to reflect on what it means to LOVE as God loves and to remember that we are called to LOVE according to His will:**

One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him, “Of all the commandments, which is the most important?”

“The most important one,” answered Jesus, “is this: ‘Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.’ The second is this: ‘Love your neighbor as yourself.’ There is no commandment greater than these.”
