## MISSION'S REPORT

The Mission Committee has a lot of good news to report for the year 2025! **Because of your generous support we were able to donate a total of \$2,250.00 to Family Services. Their money went for \$400.00 to “Schools Out Where Is Lunch” program; \$400.00 to school supplies for children in need; and \$1,000.00 towards their Christmas Program. In addition, we were able to give them a check for \$450.00 from the donations given at the Garden Sound Choir concert!** Family Services is always grateful for all our donations of food and personal items, especially the much-needed diapers.

**The Tuesday Meal Program** served **596 meals this past year, and a total of 3,699 meals since the program started! A big Thank You to the four teams that make these meals possible- Hal, Deanna & Shirley, Pam & Ed; Suzanne, Donna & Shirley; Mary Alice, Phyllis and Susan. Sandy Chambers also volunteers when needed.**

We continue to support Open Door's Code Blue program and three international students. Our committee is very grateful for your continuing support of these programs to help the people of our community.

## TREASURER'S REPORT-January, 2026

**The Finance Committee would like to thank the members of the congregation for supporting the budget for fiscal year 2026.**

While the Pulpit Committee works to find a part time pastor, **the Worship Committee has done an excellent job filling the pulpit with guest pastors.** We continue to pay these fine folks for their Sunday services, and are still currently saving money with this temporary arrangement. **Big thanks to Melissa Ferrie Healy and Noreen Szmul who have done such a great job arranging and assisting our guest ministers.**

**With Council support, I have been discussing with Tim Gusek ways to generate more interest income from the cash we currently have with Osaic Wealth (Tim Gusek's firm).** Tim is currently arranging a fund that yields a better interest rate

than CDs. Cash from our investment account will be invested for a three-month period. We still have CDs and can then compare which investment yields a higher return. Tim has generously offered to heavily discount any commissions for investing and selling.

*“Joy to the world, the Lord is come! Let Earth receive her king;

These familiar lyrics, written by English minister and hymn writer Isaac Watts in 1719, are perfect for celebrating the birth of Jesus! *But do they really matter, now that Christmas is over?* They sure do, at least for all who plan to claim God’s precious gift of the Christ child. Emmanuel, “God WITH US,” provides JOY to the world year-round!

Indeed, Psalm 100:1-2 encourages us to **“Make a JOYFUL noise to the Lord, all the earth! Serve the Lord with gladness!
