FAITHFUL SERVICE TO GOD "Daniel in the lion's den" Part I

Have you heard the story about Daniel in the lion's den? Most have, but do you know much more about Daniel and his story? **Daniel was a faithful servant of God, even in tough times.**

The book of Daniel is written when Judah had been taken into captivity by the Babylonian Empire. Daniel, a Judean, along with others were taken and forced to live in Babylon, far from home and far from the land their Lord had promised them. Daniel and the other captives were forced to assimilate to this foreign culture, made to wear its clothing, eat its food, speak its language, and answer to the names they gave them. They changed Daniel's name to Belteshazzar, which means Prince of Bel. Bel was the name of one of the Babylonian gods. But this did not change Daniel's identity. **Daniel, a Hebrew name, means "God is my judge."**

The young Daniel found himself in the midst of a strongly polytheistic religious culture. He had every opportunity to take on the ways of the Babylonians, but he didn't. **Daniel stood firm in his faith, even though he lived among the Babylonian people and under Babylonian rule.** So, why was Daniel in the lion's den?

After years in captivity, Daniel was raised to a high office in King Darius of Mede's service. King Darius thought highly of Daniel. **Daniel was well liked and trusted by the king. He was trustworthy and neither corrupt nor negligent.** The king had plans to eventually put him in charge of the whole kingdom. This did not sit well with the other administrators and court of King Darius. They were jealous of him and thought he had too much privilege and power as an outsider. **Daniel was not one of them.** He was not Medean or Persian. In retaliation, they all got together as a group and came up with an idea to get rid of him.

They convinced the king that they had a great idea that would honor him and acknowledge his sovereignty. They told him that he should issue a degree that for thirty days no prayers should be addressed to any god or man but only Darius, the king himself. If anyone disobeyed the decree, they would be thrown into the lion's den. They knew Daniel was faithful to God and would not stop praying to God. **Daniel proved himself faithful to God!**

When Daniel found out about the decree he went home to his upstairs room where the windows opened toward Jerusalem. Three times a day he kneeled and prayed always giving thanks to his God, just as he had always done. The group reported Daniel's prayers

to the king and insisted that the decree be honored. Even though the king did not want to harm Daniel, he crumbled under pressure from this group. Darius honored the decree. He ordered that Daniel be thrown into the lion's den. Before Daniel was thrown in, the king went to Daniel and said, "May you God, who you continually serve, rescue you!" Then Daniel was thrown into the den of lions. **BUT GOD! Read for yourself what happened next!**

"At the first light of dawn, the king got up and hurried to the lions' den. When he came near the den, he called to Daniel in an anguished voice, "Daniel, servant of the living God, has your God, whom you serve continually, been able to rescue you from the lions?"

Daniel answered, "May the king live forever! My God sent his angel, and he shut the mouths of the lions. They have not hurt me, because I was found innocent in his sight. Nor have I ever done any wrong before you, Your Majesty."

The king was overjoyed and gave orders to lift Daniel out of the den. And when Daniel was lifted from the den, no wound was found on him, because he had trusted in his God. (Daniel 6:19-23 NIV)

Daniel continued in faithful service to God!

Daniel continued in faithful service to God by saying no to the intentional actions of others to end life. Daniel continued to trust the God who gives life. Daniel continued in faithful service to God by saying no to the social and political decrees of the day. Daniel continued in faithful service to God by trusting in God and living a trustworthy and neither corrupt nor negligent life. Daniel continued in faithful service to God by saying no to anything and everything that stood against his faith in the sovereignty of God. Daniel continued in faithful service to God who is powerful and never leaves us or forsakes us...even in a lion's den. Daniel continued in faithful service to God! Daniel continued to trust in God!

I often wonder what lion's dens we find ourselves in today. I wonder if we will continue in faithful service to God. I wonder if we are faithfully serving God now. I wonder when we are asked to make choices, do we choose God's will and God's way. I wonder...

Wherever we are today. No matter where we were yesterday or what we have done, today we can begin our journey of faithful service to God.

It is my hope and prayer that we will.

At our last Council, **Ed Szmul** was unanimously voted in as our **new Financial Secretary**. Thank you, Ed, for volunteering and learning the details of the position. **Thank you also to Lin Brown and Janet Wilson** for always being available to answer our questions.

We are, of course, **still taking pledges for 2025**. Ed reported that in 2024 there were 22 pledges for a total of \$37,814. The total paid was \$30,687, or 81.1% of the amount pledged. If you are able, please bring your 2024 pledges up to date.

For 2025, there are 19 pledges totaling \$39,000. Our budget was hoping for \$40,000. We are so close! It would be wonderful to meet the actual goal for pledged income. Thank you to all who have pledged.

The start of a new calendar year is an excellent time for a "Spiritual Reset." I've enjoyed using the following numerical guide each week for the past several years. Perhaps it will be as useful for you as it has been for me.

Each week, prayerfully resolve to:

- 2 **do 2 things you know will have a positive impact in someone else's life** (spend 1:1 quality time, visit, call, send a card, etc.)
- o demonstrate o (zero) tolerance for a certain negative attitude you are **prone to** (frustration, irritation, despair, resentment, meanness, etc.)
- 2 **do 2 things you know will have a positive impact on your own life** (breathe, exercise, get outside, drink more water, include more colorful fruits and veggies in your diet, etc.)
- 5 **strive to demonstrate 5 positive character traits** (loving, joyful, patient, kind, caring, compassionate, steadfast, etc.)

Not sure where to begin? Spend some time with God – His ideas are always the best!

Ideally, these weekly resolutions should be written down, so you can keep track of how God is helping you "Thrive in 2025."

Heart Health Month

February has been observed as **American Hearth Health Month** since 1964 because the American Heart Association believes that raising awareness will ultimately enable people to live longer, healthier lives. We know that heart disease is largely preventable when people CHOOSE to live a healthier lifestyle: maintaining a healthy weight, controlling blood sugar, cholesterol, and high blood pressure, remaining physically active, and getting regular checkups with a physician.
