God's Paradise Restoration Plan: Part III Abraham Walked Before God

"And when Abram was ninety years old and nine, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said unto him, I am the Almighty God; walk before me and be thou perfect. And I will make my covenant: between me and thee and will multiply thee exceedingly." (Genesis 17:1-2)

WALK BEFORE ME

Walking before God is walking with God! It requires an obedience to God's Will. Abram left his home country and went out not knowing exactly where God was leading him. When we walk with God and live in the presence of God, we learn to have faith in God. We learn to trust God! We do not need to fear the direction we are going or the visible circumstances we face. God is faithful and God will guide us. We need only to listen and allow God to direct us, instead of trusting our own wisdom.

"Trust in the Lord with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths." (Proverbs 3:5-6)

BE THOU PERFECT

The word "perfect" does not mean that Abram was perfect or that in and of himself he would achieve perfection. God's word for "perfect" is not about "keeping a list of rules". This is about surrender! Surrendering our will, our wants, and our desires to God. This is about our relationship with God and our willing obedience to God.

Today, we cannot live lives of moral purity apart from first accepting Christ's finished work on the Cross. We become spiritually complete when we accept the gift of salvation God freely extends to us through Christ. After salvation, the Holy Spirit indwells within us, giving us the power to live out a life of holiness.

God called Abram to a personal relationship with Himself. He wanted Abraham to live in His very presence. God invited Abram to a closeness, a nearness...a friendship. A friendship with God is a life lived courageously by faith, open to growth and spiritual maturation through God grace. A friend of God agrees to live the adventure that is our lives. WOW!!!! Living this adventure, we acknowledge that there are things God knows, that we don't...and somehow, we find a certain comfort in trusting our *not knowing* to *God's knowing*. WOW! WOW! WOW!

ABRAHAM'S RESPONSE

"And Abram fell on his face..." (Genesis 17:3a)



HARRISENA'S 2025 BUDGET

We have created the 2025 budget by reviewing what has been spent this past year to date and comparing it to previous years to come up with the best estimate for each category.

This proposed 2025 budget has been discussed and generated with the Finance Committee, the Trustees and Council, all of whom approved of it.

Salaries for our secretary and organist have not changed in years, but they continue to serve us faithfully.

Our pastor has not asked for a raise since she began her tenure at Harrisena, nor is one included in this proposed budget.

This budget leaves us with the smallest deficit in years. This is partly due to the donations we are receiving from the home-school co-op and Oneida Church. Our fundraisers have been very successful. We have been able to use our capital funds CD money for much (not all) of our projects on the buildings. Our Memorial donations were also a big factor this year. Our new furnace in the Ed Building will save us money since we no longer will need oil.

Committee folks and officers pay for many expenses out of their own pockets, as well as, the continued support of our members and friends.

NOVEMBER IS GRATITUDE MONTH @ HCC



GRATITUDE is when the soul says thank you!

Gratitude, derived from the Latin word 'gratia,' means gratefulness or thankfulness. **Gratitude** is a simple yet powerful practice that can transform our lives. Developing a heartfelt appreciation for what we already have can significantly alter our mental and physical wellbeing. Implementing a gratitude practice has the ability to reshape our brains, uplift our moods, and improve our overall quality of life.

The Bible tells us, "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5:18)

happiness and contentment. This isn't just a temporary boost. Regular expression of gratitude may lead to long-term improvements in our overall mood and emotional state.

2. Regulating stress hormones

Expressing gratitude may also play a critical role in managing the body's stress response. When we focus on positive emotions associated with gratitude, our brain may reduce the production of stress hormones like <u>cortisol</u>. This may help to calm the <u>nervous system</u>, which could reduce feelings of anxiety or promote a <u>sense of wellbeing</u>.

3. Restructuring cognitive processes

Beyond the biochemical effects, gratitude can encourage the <u>restructuring of our cognitive</u> <u>processes</u>. It can help to promote a shift in our mindset from negative to positive thinking, by focusing more on the <u>good in our lives</u>. It's a shift that may even create lasting changes in how we perceive and interact with the world around us. By regularly practicing gratitude, we can help train our brains to be more attuned to positivity.

4. Enhancing neural connectivity

Each expression of gratitude may <u>reinforce neural pathways</u> associated with positive emotions. Over time, these pathways can become stronger, making feelings of gratitude and happiness more accessible and frequent.

5. Improving brain function in critical areas

Studies using fMRI scans (scans of the brain that show how it functions) have shown that gratitude may <u>activate several critical areas of the brain</u>, including the prefrontal cortex, which is responsible for decision-making, emotional regulation, and empathy. This activation may bring immediate feelings of contentment and could also contribute to the long-term improvement of cognitive functions associated with these areas of the brain.

Psalm 107:8-9: Let them give thanks to the Lord for his unfailing love and his wonderful deeds for mankind, for he satisfies the thirsty and fills the hungry with good things.

Hebrews 12:28-29: Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire.
